## PPC's "Women's Association" News

The next meeting of the Women's Association will be Saturday, October 10th at 9:00 a.m.- @ "A Place To Be Determined"

The Women's Association is organizing a work morning and wish list for Mary House. Mary House of Hospitality offers weekend hospitality to low-income women and families visiting inmates in the Federal Correctional Institution (FCI) at Oxford, WI. Many families must travel long distances in order to visit. Its rural location and lack of public transportation make visiting especially difficult for many families. It is staffed by volunteers who share a commitment to easing the burden on children who must travel in order to maintain ties with an incarcerated parent. We are visiting Mary House on Saturday, October 15th. We will meet in the church parking lot at 8:15 to carpool. All are welcome!

We are also organizing a wish list for Hope House. The mission of Hope House is to prevent abuse and provide support to victims of domestic and sexual violence.

The **wish list for Mary House** is: *small containers each of coffee, peanut butter and tea bags, mouse traps, disinfecting wipes and vinegar. The wish list for Hope House is: paper towels, dishwasher detergent, aluminum foil, plastic wrap, body wash, fruit snacks, women's leggings/jogging pants (all sizes), girl's tops, pants/leggings (all sizes) and 4T/5T toddler pullups.* Thank you for helping us with this mission.
