POUNDS FOR THE PANTRY

During the month of May we will again have a food drive for the Portage Food Pantry called "Pounds for the Pantry". Our goal is to raise 500# during that month. Each Sunday when you bring your food pantry items to church, they will be weighed and by the end of worship you will know how many pounds were collected that day. We will have a chart with the running total so you can see each week how close we are to meeting our goal.

Some of the items needed most are creamy peanut butter, jelly (in plastic containers), tuna fish, pancake mix and syrup, Manwich, canned stews, spaghetti sauce and noodles, canned fruit, soups, cereal, soda crackers, hamburger helper, plastic gallon bottles of juice, ketchup and mustard. This is a great time to bring in bags of flour & sugar, juice and laundry soap as they weigh more. Please check expiration dates as the food pantry can't accept any items that are expired. The first 2½ months of this year we have only donated 189 pounds to the pantry. Let's work hard to meet this goal of 500# in the month of May. Last year we surpassed our goal and collected 770 pounds.



ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

With the start of Lent began our One Great Hour of Sharing drive. This year's offering theme is "You Shall Be Called Repairers of the Breach" On the table in Parry Hall there are Fish boxes for you to collect your loose change in if you desire. You may also use the envelope enclosed in this newsletter or the one in your box of church envelopes. The offering will be collected on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday.

Pastor's Page

There has been quite a discussion over the "time changes" to which we are subjected in March and in November.

But there seems an equal amount of discussion about the "requisite adjustments" to said time changes. These changes in time, which in the Spring provide us with more "light" in the evening hours, take, as my grandmother would say, "some getting used to!"

Even though I like having more "light" in the day, these times of adjustment and transition are not always easy.

Jesus had told the disciples what was going to unfold as they made their way into Jerusalem. He was going to be arrested, convicted, tortured, beaten, executed, buried - AND on the third day be raised from the dead.

Yet, despite Jesus' repeated lessons, the disciples were not ready! They were not ready for the cross nor were they ready for the empty tomb!

And we discover, not too surprisingly, that these disciples had a difficult time with what was happening - even though this was indeed "good news."

They had to have time to adjust to this radical, life-changing new reality that God had brought into their lives. What does all of this mean? Jesus is alive? Death can really mean life? God really does love us and forgive us? God does not want to punish but to reconcile with us? WOW!

What God was doing in and through Jesus was so amazing and so radical and so countercultural and so unexpected that they had to make an adjustment in their living and in their thinking.

As awesome as Easter was they still had to "get used to it!"

Yes, just like "adjusting" to Daylight Savings Time, "getting used" to being in a loving relationship with a God of grace, hope and peace can take time.

But the wonderful thing Easter and about "getting adjusted to" God's grace and love in our lives is that God will wait for us to catch up.

Easter changes everything! And that's a change that we certainly can get "used to!"

The River Haven's Family Shelter and Men's Shelter are both open again!


One of the things that River Haven Shelter is doing is reconnecting with the community in order to recruit volunteers to help in the work and ministry of the shelter.


Being available 24/7 for those in need necessitates a significant number of people to be a part of the work of the shelter.
