"EYE GLASS COLLECTION"

As spring-cleaning season gets underway, the Portage Lions Club is asking people to look through drawers and closets for old, unwanted eyeglasses and donate them to the Lions Recycle for Sight Program.

During the month of May, the Portage Lions Club will be collecting used prescription eyeglasses and sunglasses (prescription and non-prescription) as part of a unique recycling program throughout the United States and Canada. The glasses will be distributed to those in need in developing countries where eye care is often unaffordable and inaccessible. In most developing countries, an eye exam can cost as much as one month's wages, and a single eye doctor may serve a community of hundreds of thousands of people.

This summer young people will be "required" to eat their meals "on site" (what we did before the pandemic)

## Guidelines for Worship

The Session has established the following guidelines for worship and gatherings

- Hymnals and Bibles have been returned to the pews to be used.
- The wearing of masks in worship or at other times of meetings or gatherings- *will be left to each person's individual preference and comfort level*
- The wearing of masks during singing will be *left to each person's individual's preference and comfort level*
- Seating in the sanctuary will not be "marked off" - one's seating preference and distancing will be left for each one to determine - according to their own comfort level.
- The Celebration of the Lord's Supper - Beginning Sunday, May 1 - Communion will once again be served by the Elders - there will be no "passing of the elements" however - the Elders will serve both the "bread" and the "cup" from trays - if you are more comfortable providing your own elements, you may continue to do this - also we will have a "very limited number" of pre-packaged elements available when Communion is celebrated
