During the month of October we will be doing a Terri Lynn Nut & Candy pre-order sale. You will pre-order and pay for what you would like. More information will be in the October newsletter.




What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8' rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- · Baking sheets (sprayed)

What you do:

- 1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
- 2. Place apple slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
- Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.
